CCS boys cross country: Paly's Slaney sizzles in winning Division I title

BELMONT -- Kent Slaney of Palo Alto didn't feel well down the stretch of the 2.95-mile Crystal Springs Course in Belmont. Not to worry. The junior Slaney cooked in Saturday's Central Coast Section Division I boys cross country championship race, running a 15:22 to win the title. Slaney finished 13 seconds faster than Meik Beaudoin of Bellarmine-San Jose, which won the team title with 29 points.

"I tried to go out fast and see if that held up," Slaney said. "My first two miles were great. Last mile, my stomach was thrown a bit and feeling badly. I'm looking forward to states."

Slaney ran the first two miles in 10 minutes.

"Slaney winning was to be expected and it was fantastic," Paly coach Kelsey Feeley said. "He ran that race perfectly. He didn't get lured to go out too quickly. We worked that second mile like nobody's business and build himself a cushion."

Paly took second in the team race with 65 points. Naveen Pai of Paly was 13th in 16:02.1 with teammate Henry Saul right behind in 16:06.5.
